At the last proficiency shoot we used the Falcon college shooting range, which whilst very generous is only really available to members during fixture free weekends and holidays, meaning we really needed to look at an alternative venue.

# A Case for Lead Free Ammunition In Zimbabwe By Doug MACDONALD


As Professional Guides in Zimbabwe, we are often faced with quite opposing views from our colleagues in tourism, and also the guests we guide, on our effect as humans on wildlife and the landscapes that are remaining, which we all in the tourism industry earn our livelihoods from. The bottom line is that whichever end of the spectrum you come from or believe in, no one can dispute that humans are toxic and have an effect on our environments whenever we enter that space, or we have an impact that may have been created very far away but still manages to trickle down into these "preserved" landscapes in a variety of ways and it is for the most part not good.

When you look at the range of threats that these landscapes are faced with it can often seem an insurmountable challenge. However, I do firmly believe that if we all did something little, which has no great impact on how your day goes, this could have a massive global effect. I think it is a poor excuse to say "no point in me doing it if no-one else does it". We just have to start somewhere, and if we all start to do something it gets much easier to call out those on the fringes. Can you imagine if every person on this planet picked up two pieces of plastic every day, we all see much more than that, so it's not hard to find and will not take you out of your daily routine or comfort zone. 7 billion people x 2 = 14 billion pieces not entering our ecosystems in an unmanaged way. This is not insignificant.

So, my main point is that I recently had the privilege to spend time with Andre Botha from the Endangered Wildlife Trust and also the co-chair of the IUCN Vulture Specialist Group who do a tremendous amount of work and research on vultures on many levels. We had some fascinating discussions, or more me learning and he explaining, on the effects they are uncovering of lead poisoning in vultures and he shared with me two research papers - one research done in Botswana, which is quite specific on lead levels in the environment from hunting and the effect thereof on critically endangered White Backed Vultures. The other based on work done in South Africa that focused on lead poisoning and its effects on a range of vultures and other predatory birds. When you start reading you quickly see that these studies have been mirrored right across the world with similar conclusions and, as with all these papers, there is lots of background and methodology etc. plus explanations on how key the vultures are to our natural environments, which all helps to explain their conclusions, but I won't go into that here. At the bottom of this I have attached the links to those studies if you would like to read more, but here are a few take-aways from these papers, which I think need careful consideration by us in tourism. Guides - don't feel this does not include you, as we have all used a bullet on something at some stage, so our hands are not clean.

- 1. Vultures across the planet are facing a precipitous decline in numbers for a variety of reasons which include both direct and indirect poisoning, the use of Diclofenac in the veterinary industry, man-made structures (powerlines, vehicles etc.) loss of habitat, harvesting for the traditional belief trade.
- 2. There are a few potential sources of lead in a vulture's diet. However the leading logical source is from carcasses, either in the offal or muscles of the animal carcasses shot with lead based ammunition that they are ingesting. Sometimes this is supplied to them by the creation of "vulture restaurants" if the food is not

carefully vetted.



- 3. The most likely source of this lead in these carcasses is from lead bullets, either from fragmenting bullets or lead shot found in the muscle and viscera of a shot animal.
- 4. The lead has a half-life of 14 days, which means that it although it gets absorbed very quickly into their systems, probably as a result of their intense digestive systems (PH level of 1!!), but it does break down after initially effecting their organs and is then stored in their bone structures for their lifetimes and so builds up more and more (biomagnification). This then, among others, effects the shell development process during laying giving a much lower success rate of nesting.
- 5. The development of lead poisoning in a vulture primarily involves inhibition of the cellular function of Ca2+ \* and consequent interference with neuro-transmitter systems and synaptogenesis, as well as disruption of the blood brain barrier and decreasing total brain capacity with prolonged exposure.
- 6. Among birds lead could potentially impact every organ and system in the body, most notably the central nervous and haematological systems.
- 7. Acute exposure at extreme levels can lead to mortality, while chronic or long-term exposure can cause a variety of latent symptoms, including increased lethargy, decreased foraging ability, anorexia, decreased spatial awareness, breast-muscle atrophy, loss of strength and coordination, drooping wings, decreased reproductive success and depressed immune response.

So my conclusion goes back to my original point that if we all did something little it can help the big picture for vultures, even if it is a small leg up, it's better than what we are doing now. We should all be trying to get rid of lead-based ammunition in our industry and make that the standard that we all abide to. It is pointless waiting for legislation on the topic as we all know that is not coming anytime soon, so I believe we as an industry can enforce this with simple methods of requiring all clients coming to the country that they do not bring lead-based ammunition, there are alternatives out there. Let's also not forget that the signature statement of our association is "Ethics are Everything" which in my opinion does not only mean we follow the rules laid down, but it should also include our own moral judgements on how we effect our environment and workplaces when you know the effect you are having. \* Calcium ions (Ca2+) contribute to the physiology and biochemistry of organisms' cells. They play an important role in signal transduction pathways, where they act as a second messenger, in neurotransmitter release from neurons, in contraction of all muscle cell types, and in fertilization.



## Meatballs

BY BETTY CROCKER

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 lb lean (at least 80%) ground beef
- 1/2 cup Italian-style bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1 small onion, finely chopped (1/4 cup)
- **1** egg



#### Method:

- Heat oven to 400°F. Line 13x9-inch pan with foil; spray with cooking spray.
- In large bowl, mix all ingredients. Shape mixture into 24 (1 1/2-inch) meatballs. Place 1 inch apart in pan.
- Bake uncovered 18 to 22 minutes or until temperature reaches 160°F and no longer pink in center.

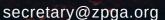

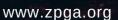

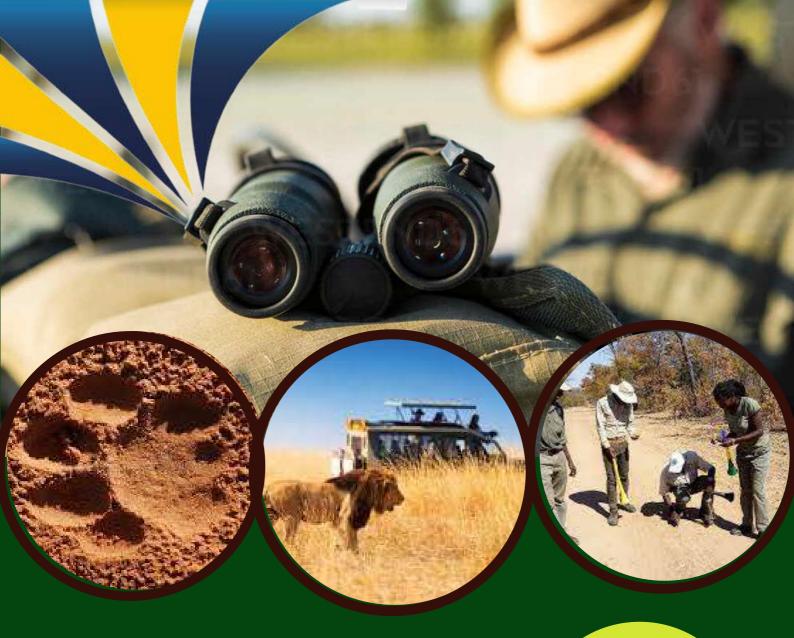

## Midlands Black Rhino Conservancy - Open Letter

Rhino Capture Update 25th May.

As per the report on Tuesday, 23rd May, the capture team, truck and helicopters were all in place early Tuesday and ready to capture and move our female Black Rhino, Togara back into the Conservancy.

Togara thought otherwise and did her best to avoid capture by staying in thick bush and started making her own way in the direction of home. Our teams have tracked her for two days and on the morning of the 25th May she arrived back to home range after a 100km round trip over 14 days.

The team work on the ground has been phenomenal and Zimparks should be saluted for the amazing work they have done together with many others.

The final costing of this necessary exercise has come in at US\$3,000. The recent pledge that went out has now covered the costs. As mentioned, the excess will go to the GAP anti-poaching work in the area. So a big thank you to all out there for your conservation commitment and teamwork, your assistance and generosity.

May we bear the Midlands Conservancy in mind moving forward, as a great wildlife and conservation area, deserving protection and a future.
