
## Reforestation of Hwange Main Camp — A Proposal


Outline of the Situation:

In the 1960s camping at Main Camp, Hwange involved finding the shade of a clump of large trees as protection from the blazing sun at any time of the day. This is no longer possible, not because humans desperate for firewood have chopped down the trees (as is the case in much of Zimbabwe) but because many of those trees have simply died of old age. The plentiful groves of mature trees that attracted the designers of Main Camp in the 1950s belong for the most part to species that do not live beyond 100 years – and their time was up. It is immediately apparent when one drives into the area of tourist accommodation that there is a serious shortage of flourishing trees and the area is dominated by trees that are dying or bare stumps of dead trees or spaces where trees used to be.







Layout of the tourist accommodation

(This map was drawn up using a satellite photo – it is therefore easy to see that the pale areas have few if any trees.)



At first glance the area where the Lodges are situated (to the right of the entrance to the accommodation area) is well supplied with large trees but in fact many have died or are dying and they are just screened by the remaining trees.





Chalet Area

There are a few large trees remaining in the Chalet area but the majority are dying or have completely died.



## Cottage Area

The Cottage area has lost almost all its tree cover. The only shade available comes from the thatched gazebo in the center of the area.



#### Camping/Caravanning Area

The caravan and camping area is the hardest hit by the loss of trees and perhaps the area where it would be most desirable to provide trees and their shade for people living under canvas and cooking in the open.









On the 26th October, 2020, strong winds blew down two of the remaining trees in the campsite area.

#### WHAT IS NEEDED?


#### Numbers?

A map of the lodge area here is being used as an example to suggest the trees that it would be desirable to plant (represented by circles) to replace dead trees and to fill in empty areas. This comes to approximately 50 trees in the lodge area alone. (To repopulate the whole of Main Camp's tourist accommodation would call for upwards of 200 young trees - to allow for the fact that many of the remaining trees will die in the near future).

Obviously it would be better to plant a handful of trees now rather than none but it would be great to see at least a hundred trees planted in the accommodation area as a whole.

#### Species?

Obviously it would be desirable to plant those species that are occurring naturally in Hwange and originally populated the Main Camp space. The predominant species is



Camelthorn (Vachellia erioloba), which fortunately grows relatively fast. Another species that was common is the African Teak (Baikiaea plurijuga). Other big, shady trees found in the area are Scotsman's Rattle (Amblygonocarpus andongensis), African Wattle (Peltophorum africanum), False Mopane (Guibourtia coleosperma) and Leadwood (Combretum imberbe). Other species that are not shady but are characteristic are the African Rain Tree or Apple-leaf (Philenoptera violacea formerly Lonchocarpus capassa) and Silver Terminalia or Silver Cluster-leaf (Terminalia sericea). It would be vital to take the advice of an expert on how to maximize the advantages of fast growth with the judicious sprinkling of slow-growing trees that will only come into their own after many years.

#### Protection?

There is absolutely no point in planting young trees unless they are supplied with protection from being browsed by animals, such as the resident herd of impala who roam Main Camp every night. Supports and some sort of fencing or cage will be necessary for each sapling. Jos Dankwertz has spoken of some sort of environmentally friendly tree protection that he knows of (and could be approached for information) but otherwise there needs to be arrangements made with gum poles or metal poles and pieces of diamond mesh fencing.

#### When?

It would be desirable to plant the trees just before the rainy season (i.e. October or November) so that the young trees get a good start in natural rainfall. They might then require a little supplementary water in the dry season for a year or two. Maybe a competition could be arranged in which school children took individual responsibility for trees?

## DEFENDING HUNTER'S RIGHTS IN A CHANGING WORLD BY ABE SMIT

It is without doubt that the voices of International Animal Rights groups and Animal Welfare organizations have permeated into corridors of influence in Africa and across the globe. Very little of this collected money makes it way back to Africa and these organisations become wealthier and ever more powerful each moment.

In all this mayhem affecting the Sport Hunting Industry (which includes hunters, professional guides and safari operators) we have not spoken with one collective voice, to expose the misleading and false information circulated by these groups. We have instead become victims of backlash, defamation, illegal persecution, harassment and cyber-bullying. This in turn is affecting business sustainability and effects the correct utilisation of wildlife in terms of National Constitutions - our enjoyment of fundamental rights are being infringed.

Hunters and conservationists are not by nature closeted in offices and stuck to keyboards and savvy with the latest tech developments (never mind the huge imminent threat from Artificial Intelligence) and we are finding ourselves in a situation where we are losing the war for no other reason than we are not protecting our own rights for lack of experience and understanding in the strange realms that we now find ourselves in.

For this reason Conservation Justice Project ("CJP") was created as an informal alliance of various entities in the Wildlife Conservation arena falling under the auspices of Impisi Conservation Trust. The Trust is duly registered in terms of the Laws in Zimbabwe.

Its mission is to Defend and Promote the Scientific and Sustainable Utilization of Wildlife Resources in Africa in terms of IUCN Sustainable Use definitions and the protection of African Wildlife Assets. Inter alia our objectives include:

Promoting the establishment of an International Body which represents and defends the interests of the Sport Hunting Industry across the world.

- To facilitate robust investigation and preparation of Criminal and Civil case files against Cyber bulling, Defamation and Harassment of Individuals or corporate entities who support Sustainable Utilization of Wildlife Resources.
- To provide legal advice and guidance to Individuals or corporate entities who support Sustainable Utilization of Wildlife Resources on their Constitutional and other rights in terms of the Law.
- To engage with Law enforcement agents through training to capacitate them to effectively tackle cases of Cyber Wildlife Crime.
- To provide scientific evidence against fake news being published by these wildlife racketeers.
- To provide assistance in the preparation of any legal or criminal actions to be taken against any perpetrators.
- To promote awareness of the importance of self-governance especially in the area of regulated free trade of African Wildlife products.



## Delicious Guinea Fowl Stew: BY LAURA SMITH

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 guinea fowl, cut into pieces
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 carrots, peeled and chopped
- 2 celery stalks, chopped
- 1 red bell pepper, diced
- 1 cup mushrooms, sliced
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 1 cup red wine
- 4 cups chicken or vegetable broth
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Chopped fresh parsley for garnish



#### **Instructions:**

- 1. Heat the olive oil in a large, heavy-bottomed pot or Dutch oven over medium heat. Add the guinea fowl pieces and brown them on all sides. Remove the browned guinea fowl from the pot and set aside.
- 2. In the same pot, add the chopped onion, minced garlic, carrots, celery, and red bell pepper. Sauté the vegetables until they begin to soften, about 5 minutes.
- 3. Add the sliced mushrooms to the pot and cook for another 3-4 minutes until they start to release their moisture.
- 4. Push the vegetables to one side of the pot and add the tomato paste to the cleared area. Cook the tomato paste for about 1 minute to caramelize it slightly.
- 5. Pour in the red wine and scrape the bottom of the pot to deglaze, loosening any browned bits.
- 6. Return the browned guinea fowl pieces to the pot. Add the chicken or vegetable broth, bay leaf, and dried thyme. Season with salt and pepper to taste.
- 7. Bring the stew to a boil, then reduce the heat to low and cover the pot. Simmer for about 1 to 1.5 hours, or until the guinea fowl is tender and cooked through.
- 8. Once the guinea fowl is cooked, remove the bay leaf from the stew. Taste and adjust the seasoning if needed.
- 9. Serve the guinea fowl stew hot, garnished with chopped fresh parsley. It pairs well with crusty bread or steamed rice.






